
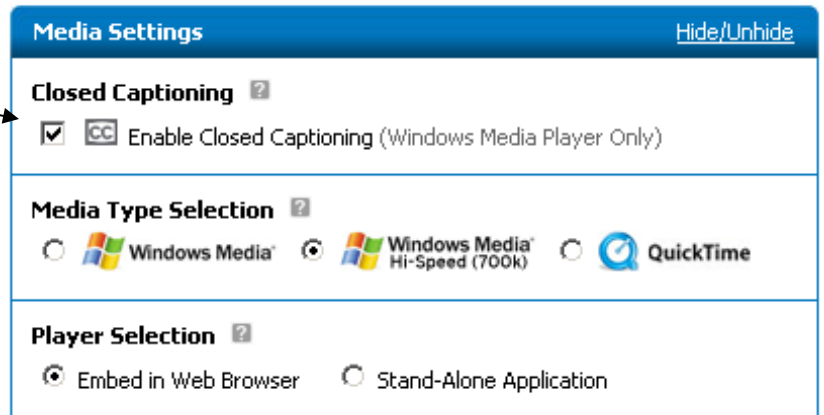


Enabling Closed Captioning in Windows Media Player v. 10


Enable the closed captioning for a video on the Unitedstreaming website. Around 500 videos have this feature.

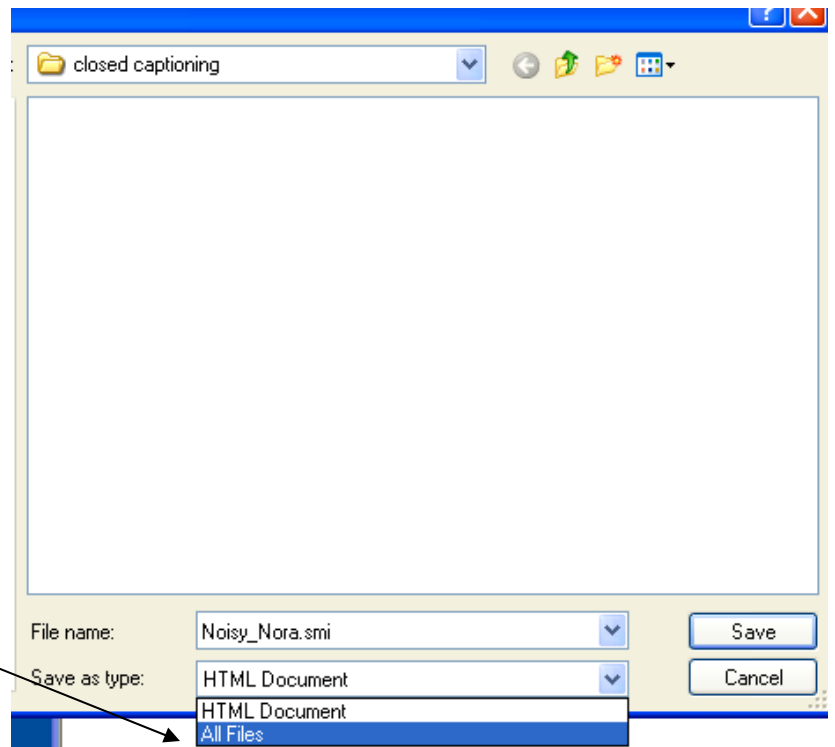
The  symbol means closed captioning is available for that title.



1.

To play a video with closed captioning in **Windows Media Player**:

- Create a video folder
- Download your video clip from the Unitedstreaming website (asx file) to the folder by right clicking the download button and selecting 'Save Target As'
- Download the **cc** file (smi file) to **the same folder** by right clicking on the  icon and selecting 'Save Target As' (select 'All Files')



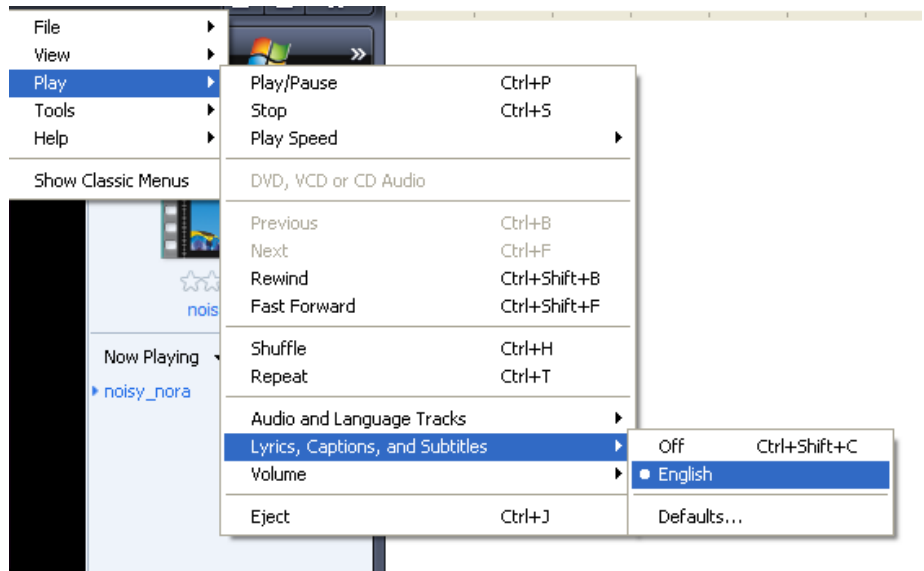

Give both of these files the same name.

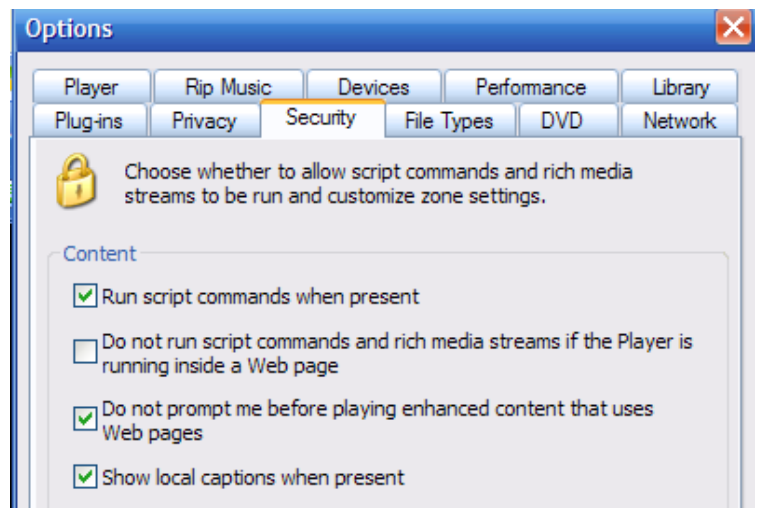
For example:

Noisy_Nora.asx
Noisy_Nora.smi

3. To turn on the subtitles:
 Select **Play from the Windows Media Player menu bar**
 Select **Lyrics, Captions and Subtitles**
 De-select 'Off' for 'English'



4. In version 10, an additional step is required because Windows Media Player's security settings block the display of captions by default. To assure that the display of captions is permitted, perform the following steps:
 You can press Alt+T to activate the Tools menu (this hotkey combination will work even if the application menu is not visible)
 Select **Tools, Options from the menu bar**
 Select the **Security** tab
 Check the box beside "**Show local captions when present**" and "**Run script commands when present....**"



Select **OK**

5. Double click on the video file to play it in the Windows Media Player—narrator text should be displayed in the player at the bottom of the video.
